



Homework Requirements – Year 4

Children in Year 4 will be provided with a 'Reading Record and Weekly Diary'. This, alongside Teams, is used as another means of communication between home and school. Each time homework is set, it will be written in the diary along with the date that it should be completed by. At the end of the week, **we ask parents to sign the relevant page in the diary** in order to check that all homework tasks have been completed. At times, class teachers may write a note home in the diary, so it is important that you check it on a regular basis. Similarly if you would like to write a note to your child's class teacher, please feel free to write it in the diary. **Children will need to have their diaries in school every day to record homework for the following week.**

English

English tasks will be pages set from the Year 4 CGP English Homework Book. Children should self-mark their homework using the answers provided at the back of the book. Please support your child in doing this.

Spellings will be given weekly, on a Tuesday. Students will choose their own set of words and learn these at home. Pupils will be tested in class the following Monday.

Maths

Maths Homework tasks will be set on MyMaths, the children will receive an instant mark.

The children will also use either Timestables Rockstars or PurpleMash weekly to practice their multiplications for the Multiplications Table Check in June.

Topic

Students will be required to submit their topic homework by uploading the document on Teams or bringing it into school.

Children should be able to complete the task without parental support. Please do feel free to support your child with their tasks, but the majority of the work must be their own.

Reading at home

Children are expected to read a colour banded book appropriate for their level of fluency and comprehension at home for a minimum of 15 minutes every day. It is advantageous for children to read independently as well as having the opportunity to read to or with an adult who can ask them questions about the text, this is recommended three times every week. **Children are required to record their reading in their 'Reading Record and Weekly Diary' each day.** These will also be checked by school adults. Children will also visit the library every week, please ensure your child has their book in school on their Library Days
