

Year 3 Curriculum Map 2025-2026

English

Writing: We will continue to develop writing a range of engaging narratives, developing the use of adverbs and adjectives to add detail to our writing. We will also learn to apply fronted adverbials to add interest to our sentences.

Reading: The weekly Guided Reading sessions will continue to focus on exploring vocabulary and developing inferencing skills.

Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling: We will be developing the use of inverted commas to punctuate direct speech. Also focus on using paragraphs to organise our writing. We will continue to follow the RWI programme to learn spelling rules.

Key Texts: Ice Trap (Meredith Hooper), The Twits (Roald Dahl), Traditional Tales

Spring Term



Maths

We will continue to build upon components from our 5 blocks in Maths this term, (Number, Shape & Space, Fractions, Decimals and Percentages, Measures and Handling Data) The children will be revising the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. They will learn to recognise angles as a description of a turn and build on their understanding of symmetry. We will also be looking at 'Measures' and developing the children's knowledge of telling the time, length, volume and capacity. Children will become familiar with different units of measure and begin to develop their understanding of measures in everyday life. We will also be continuing to focus on our rapid recall of multiplication and division facts.

Art & Design

This term in Art, the children will use a number of brush techniques using thick and thin brushes to produce shapes, patterns and lines. They will be experimenting with creating mood with colour. The children will explore the work of Joan Miro.

Computing

This half term, the children will be deepening their coding skills, exploring the connection between events and actions, using Scratch and Espresso Coding. Later on in the term, they will be creating branching databases, this will introduce them to the basics of Boolean logic.

Design & Technology

This term in Design & Technology, we will be focusing on Textiles. The children will be looking at a range of textile products and will explore different stitches, fabrics and fastenings. They will then use the knowledge they have gained to make a fabric bag.

Geography

This term in Geography, we will learn about the Polar regions. Children will learn about how humans and animals have adapted to survive in these conditions. They will also investigate how icebergs and glaciers are formed and the impact of climate change.

History

In History, we will be learning about the History of Pinner. We will be using different sources including pictures and maps to find out about the changes. Children will also learn about the history of the school and how it has changed over time.

Languages

This term in French, we will continue to focus on speaking and listening. The children will be learning the French names for different types of weather and the seasons. They will also be learning classroom instructions and colours.

Music

This term in Music, the children will be learning how to play the ukulele. The children will learn how to read simple musical notation. They will create and play repeated patterns, and learn simple songs, demonstrating active listening.

PE & Sport

The pupils will be taking part in Dodgeball, SMC, Tri-Golf and Basketball. Across all these sports / activities, the children will continue to work on their strength, balance, techniques and tactical vision, learning how to improve individually and as a team.

PSHE

In PSHE, we will learn about what it means to be fit and healthy. We will continue to learn about emotions and strategies helping us to deal with difficult situations. Much of these topics will be covered during the weekly Fresh Arts Bounce workshop.

Religious Education

This term in RE, we will be learning about the teachings of Buddha. We will also learn about how charitable organisations support those in need. We will look at the importance of charity in different faiths.

Science

This term in Science, the children will finish the rocks and soils topic. Then, they will be learning about forces, with a focus on magnets. Towards the end of the term, we will begin our plants topic— learning about the function of the different parts of a plant.
