Word	Meaning
Coast	The seashore and the land close to it
Human feature	A feature that has been made or changed by humans
Physical feature	A feature that has been formed by nature
Compass	An instrument used for finding directions. North, South, East and West.
Estuary	The wide part of a river, where it flows into the sea
Cliff	A steep rock face, especially near the coast
Pier	A long structure that goes out to sea for people to walk on, or fish from
Beach	An area of sand or stones between the sea and the land

- Southend **pier** is over a mile long and is the world's longest pleasure pier.
- There are 11 kilometres of seafront at Southend.
- Southend has been a city since 1st March 2022.

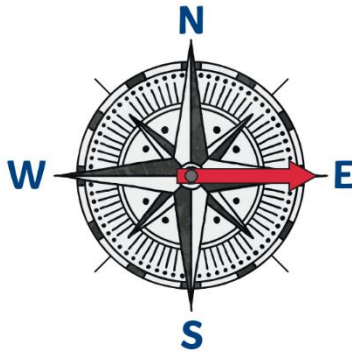




Where is Southend?

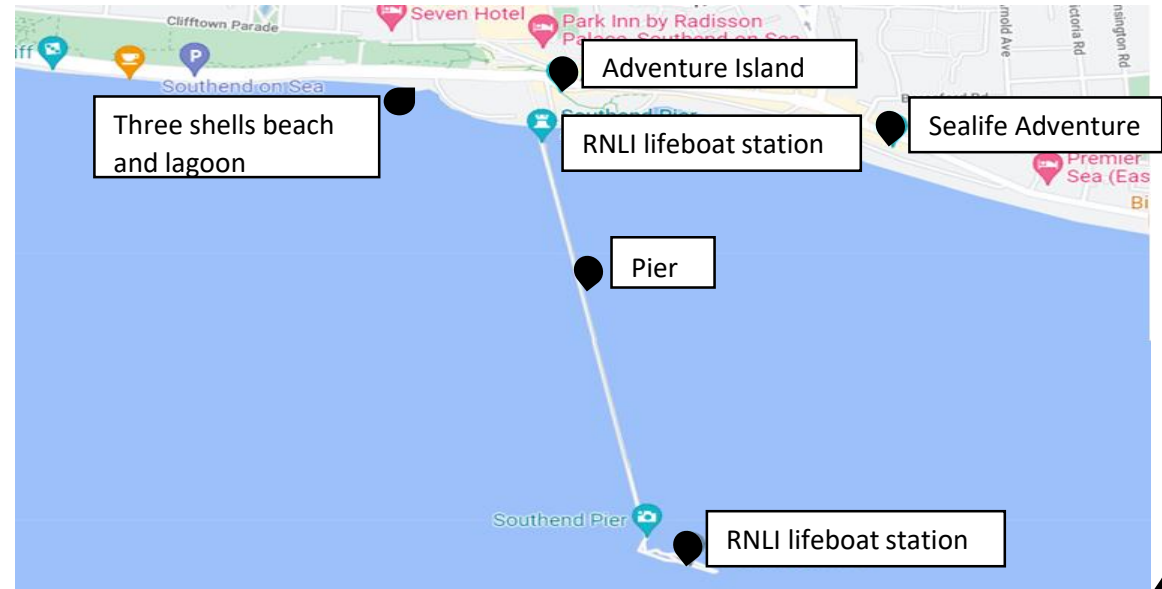


- From our school it takes about 1 hour and 30 minutes to get to Southend.
