Word	Meaning
Village	Consists of a group of houses, together with other buildings such as a church and a school , in a countryside area.
Hamlet	A hamlet is a small settlement, smaller than a village.
Timeline	It is used to describe the order in which events happened.
Sources	Where you retrieve information from. For example; diaries, books, photographs, etc.
Century	A period of a hundred years.
Middle Ages	Was a period in European history that came between ancient and modern times.
Mayor	The head of government in a village, town, or city.
Local	Belonging to the area where you live .
Immigration	People moving to another country to live there permanently.
Pinner	A suburb in the borough of Harrow, Greater London, England.

Facts about Pinner

Pinner:

- Pinner is centuries old.
- It was one of the ten hamlets of the medieval Harrow Manor.
- The name Pinner is nowadays considered to be of Saxon origin.
- Amongst the oldest written records of Pinner is one telling us that the church was here during the 1230s.

Pinner Fair:

- The first Pinner Fair took place in 1336 by royal permission.
- The Archbishop of Canterbury who, at the time, was also Lord of the Manor of Harrow, was given permission by King Edward III to hold two fairs a year.
- The fair has been protected by Royal Charter which gives its organisers royal permission to hold the fair on the first Wednesday after the May Bank Holiday.
