Being good: Humanism

Being good: Christianity

Jesus taught **Christians** how to be good to each other in the story of the **Good Samaritan**. In this story, some people walked past a man who has been hurt on the side of the road.

Most people ignored the man and kept on walking but a Samaritan went to check on the man and helped him get better.

The story teaches **Christians** that they need to be kind to everyone, even strangers that they don't know.
