Celtic Round Houses



The **Iron Age** is the time when people began to use iron to make tools and weapons.

The **houses** had no windows.

The roof was made from straw and mud.

Tudor Houses



Tudor houses had wooden frames and wet clay called wattle and daub filled the gaps. **Tudor houses** were wonky because the wood was cut by hand. Some had thatched roofs made from straw.

Victorian Houses



Queen Victoria was on the throne.

Houses were built from brick, stone and slate roofs.

Houses were built in rows. They were often small and had two rooms upstairs and downstairs. Most had no inside toilet, but had it in the backyard!



Modern homes



Now some people live in older **homes** that were built a long time ago, but they have been made more **modern** and comfortable to live in. New **homes** are built all the time but are different to homes from the past.
