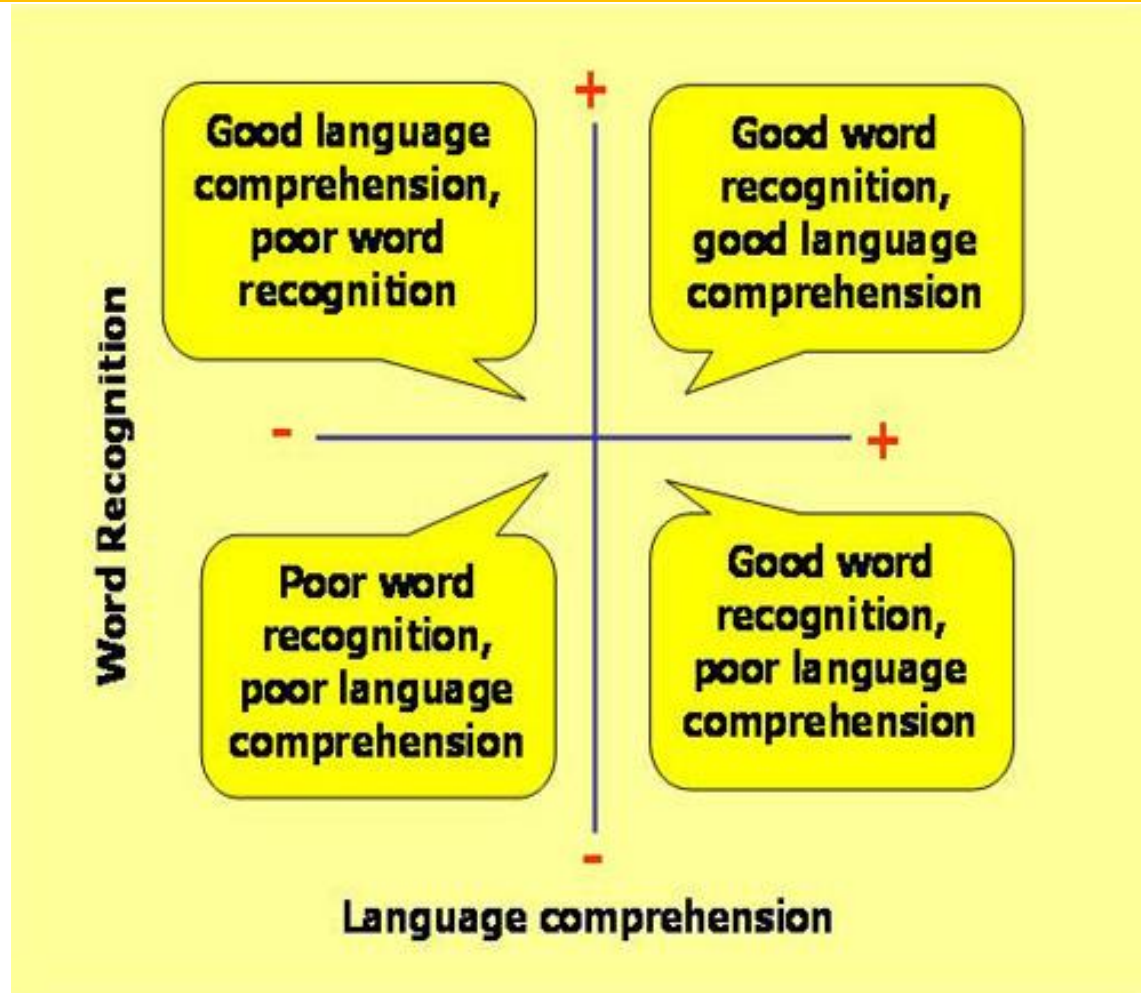

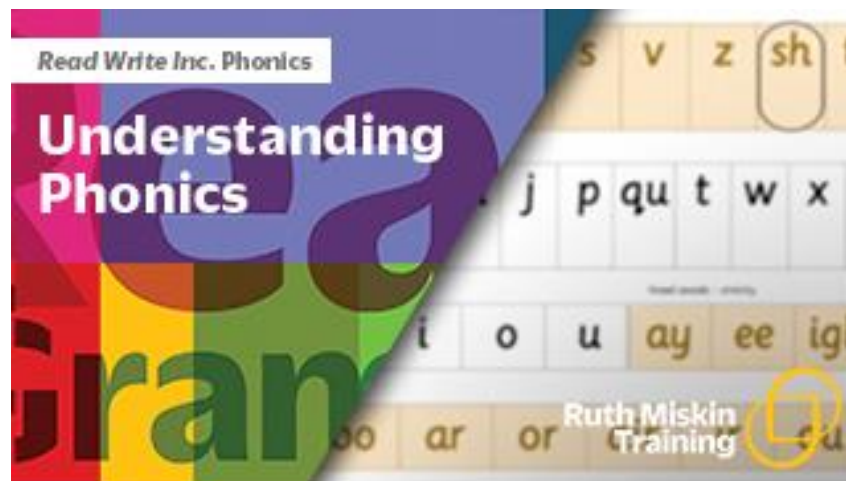

Children love reading because we make it easy for them



- We only read books with sounds that children already know
- We never ask children to guess words from pictures
- We make sure that children can read the book sin the story before they read the story
- We read a wide variety of other books to children with all the different versions of the sounds
- We learn to form letters correctly and develop a strong grip
- We spell many words and encourage children to have a go – phonetically plausible is ok!

Children love writing because we make it easy for them



- We want children to be successful writers
- We read great stories aloud and make them lively and engaging, so that the children's imaginations are captured
- We introduce key challenge words when we introduce a story, to encourage children to use them in their writing (shook with fright, scuttle, scrumptious, wearily, grumpy, haul)
- We hold and edit sentences
- We teach explicit grammatical concepts
- We use TOL to model the thought processes behind writing successfully
- We use pictures to provoke conversations
